

ASO and TSO Partner for Canada 150



This past November 17 saw yet another milestone for the Alberta Symphony Orchestra, the brainchild of pianist and Conservatory faculty member **Emilio De Mercato**. Beginning with only a handful of musicians in 2015, a full 55-piece orchestra now took to the Winspear stage for homage to a Canadian icon, Glenn Gould.

The Toronto Symphony Orchestra acquired federal funding for a sesquicentennial Gould tribute as part of the "Canada Mosaic," which involved several orchestras across the country. Emilio was approached a year ago to involve the ASO as part of the project. The November 17 program included Beethoven's "Emperor" Concerto (recorded famously by Gould) played and conducted by Emilio from the keyboard. Also on the program was Dvorak's Symphony no. 9 (subtitled "From the New World") and a new work by Ottawa-based composer Kelly-Marie Murphy commissioned by the TSO for the occasion.

Young Violinists Return from New York



Our Spring/Summer edition reported that brothers Justin and Jasper Ng (ages 10 and 7), violin students of **Frank Ho**, received not one, but two awards from the American Protégé Competition and were invited to perform in Carnegie Hall last July, with a return visit in December. From Alberta College to the Big Apple! Well done, boys!

Body Awareness the Focus of PD Workshop

Our October 24 Professional Development workshop saw some nine participants moving slowly about the room, eyes closed, hands on abdomen, with full concentration on breathing and how the feet made contact with the floor.

This was one of a number of body mapping exercises that our colleague **Bianca Baciu** led us through—exercises that she regularly prescribes for her piano students that she says produces "immediate positive results." Bianca described the US-based Andover Education as "not quite in the mainstream" with respect to music teaching in Canada, but that it is has a broad application. With emphasis on the flow of the body, and with the individual's mental well-being as the goal, this somatic method of learning has obvious potential in the performing arts, and indeed is worth exploring by music teachers.

Bianca referred us to the Mindfulness Institute of Edmonton, which runs stress prevention workshops for professionals in various disciplines (music teachers?). Further information on their programs can be found at www.mindfulnessinstitute.ca.

The concert was capped by a performance of Liszt's *La Campanella* under the sure hands of Louise Lu (piano student of **David Tutt**). Two of **Lary Benson's** voice students (one in costume!) provided novelty to the program with humorous selections by Tom Lehrer, Tom Jones and Harvey Schmidt.
